Cunningham was introduced to Varner in 2013, when he was commissioned by FWCD to design the campus map for festival. "I was very impressed with Charles and his work, and I invited him to teach two illustration workshops at the festival," she said. "The workshops were very well received by students. I am thrilled that Charles returned to FWCD and that the painting/drawing students have the opportunity to learn about cartooning from an expert."

A TCU alumnus, Varner graduated with a double major in Commercial Art and Sculpture. He attended classes at The Kansas City Art Institute and has been recognized by the Hallmark Cards Scholastic Art Awards. His designs and illustrations appeared in the 1971 Horned Frog Yearbook. This publication received The Printing Industry Award for best college yearbook. Varner also illustrated a major recruitment campaign for TCU and began his freelance illustration career in 1972. Varner worked for Don Ivan Punchatz at Sketch Pad Studio after graduating from TCU.

Varner is a member of the New York Society of Illustrators, the Houston Society of Illustrators, and the Dallas Society of Illustrators.
